

## Sixth Form Dress Code

<i>KPS Sixth Form (day wear)</i>	
<p>Matching colour suit jacket and trousers (blue, black or grey only).</p> <p>Sixth Form Chapter Tie.</p> <p>Formal shirt, long or short sleeved, plain, striped or plainly patterned only.</p> <p>Round, roll or V necked jumper (black, blue, brown, grey, white, red, pink, green and maroon colours permitted). Jumpers should be plain, striped or plainly patterned only.</p> <p>Sweatshirts are not permitted, nor slouch style jumpers which prevent jackets being worn over the top of the jumper.</p> <p>Jackets should be worn moving around school.</p> <p>No hoodies should not be worn, unless for a sporting activity.</p> <p>Plain navy, black or grey socks.</p> <p>Plain conventional shoes.</p> <p>Any boots and 'heavy shoes' such as Doc Martins, trainers, canvas shoes, clogs, sling-backs, platform or raised-heel shoes are not permitted.</p> <p>Sixth form boys may wear a discrete amount of make-up, nail varnish and jewellery, but they may wear no more than one simple stud in each ear and no other piercing jewellery. Body tattoos and graffiti are not permitted.</p>	<p>Suit jacket (blue, black or grey only).</p> <p>Suit trousers, suit skirt or suit dress (blue, black or grey only). If suit trousers or a suit skirt is worn it must match the suit jacket.</p> <p>Leggings, legging style trousers or bodycon style dresses are not permitted.</p> <p>Jacket pin badge with chapter colour to be worn at all times.</p> <p>Formal long or short sleeved shirt or blouse, plain, striped or plainly patterned only. Bare shoulders are not permitted.</p> <p>Round, roll or V necked jumper (black, blue, brown, grey, white, red, pink, green and maroon colours permitted). Jumpers should be plain, striped or plainly patterned only.</p> <p>Sweatshirts are not permitted, nor slouch style jumpers which prevent jackets being worn over the top of the pullover.</p> <p>Jackets should be worn moving around school.</p> <p>No hoodies should not be worn, unless for a sporting activity.</p> <p>Plan navy, black or grey socks with trousers.</p> <p>Plain navy, black, grey or flesh coloured tights.</p> <p>Plain conventional shoes.</p> <p>Any boots and 'heavy shoes' such as Doc Martins, trainers, canvas shoes, clogs, sling-backs, platform or raised-heel shoes are not permitted.</p> <p>Sixth form girls may wear a discrete amount of make-up, nail varnish and jewellery, but they may wear no more than one simple stud in each ear and no other piercing jewellery. Body tattoos and graffiti are not permitted.</p>

Hair for all students:

Hair should be neat, tidy and safe. It must not be of a style that makes it noticeably stand out from the norm and hair gel or other hair products should not be noticeably used. Eyebrows should not be shaved and hair must not be cut to less than a 'number 3' anywhere. Hair should not fall into the eyes when working nor fall in such a way that it inhibits eye-contact with others. This rule prevents hair from becoming entangled or catching on fire in practical lessons and enables respectful relationships and effective communication. If necessary, hair must be tied back using clips and/or dark coloured bands or similar.

Adornments are not permitted. Noticeably dyed hair, or hair that is dyed to an un-natural colour, is not permitted and likewise hair must not be streaked.

N.B. The spirit of the Sixth Form Dress Code is to avoid confrontation between staff and students. The 2019 version reflects the school's positive reaction to student voice. Earphones should only be worn by Sixth Formers in study periods and not generally around school. **Final decisions on whether the dress of a student is appropriate will ultimately be made by staff.**
